Mission Statement of St. Philip RE Program

To create opportunities for the whole family to grow closer to Christ in the context of the parish

The Religion Education office of St. Philip will provide opportunities for the **whole family** to grow in their faith and relationship with our Lord.

We offer:

1. Religious education for children (RE)
2. Mandatory Parent Faith Formation (PFF)

More information about PFF is available in the section on Sacraments.

Religious Education for Children (RE)

Eligibility

Religious Education Classes are open for children in Kindergarten through 8th grade and those children missing Sacraments whose families are registered and active members of St. Philip Parish. To become a registered member, you have to live within the boundaries of the parish and visit the parish office to request a registration card. You can also obtain the form from our website. Once you are assigned a member number you can start the process to enroll your child in the RE program.

Registration Fee

In-person and online programs: \$100 for one student; \$130 for 2 students; \$150 for 3 or more.
Homeschool program: \$50 for one student, \$70 for 2 students; \$100 for 3 or more.

Students in the last year of their sacramental preparation (Catechumenate*, Confirmation and First Holy Communion) will have an additional charge to cover the cost of retreats, days or recollection, Confirmation robe, etc.

*Catechumenate is the program for the Sacraments of Initiation, those who are not baptized.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

In the event of moving away from St. Philip, please contact the RE office for proof of attendance to present at new the parish. We cannot refund tuition after the first week of class. Fees for retreats can be refunded up to one month before the event.

Documentation Needed

At the time of registration, the parents of new students need to provide the RE Office with a copy of their child's Baptismal certificate. Children in their last year of sacramental preparation will have to submit additional forms. These forms will be given at the corresponding meeting and will be available from our website.

Students Who Have Not Been Baptized

We will hold an informational meeting in the fall for parents whose children have not been baptized. For program requirements, please see the section on Sacramental Preparation below.

Online RE Program

The online program is open to students in kindergarten through 8th grade. How does this program work? The student will have access to a platform called *My Catholic Faith Delivered* (MCFD) which is based on the *Faith and Life* series for the corresponding grade. There will be no virtual teaching from a parish catechist, Zoom or the like, with one possible exception. (See section on Safe Environment Program). Each grade is composed of Lessons which have a learning objective and varied learning styles to make it easy for the student to retain the information. The learning styles include prayer, reading, narration, music, etc. Parent and student will be able to see the student book in English and Spanish from the platform in PDF format. The student will not get a physical book. MCFD will send the DRE regular reports on the students and their progress (how much time they have spent on the platform, lessons done, etc.). We will assign a catechist to keep communication with parents and to let them know that we are here if they need help or have a question.

Requirements:

- Families must submit the completed registration form and payment
- Parents must provide at least one email address that belongs to one of them; no student email addresses allowed
- The family must have access to internet and electronic devices that allow for the online platform to be used
- Parents are responsible to supervise their child's time online
- Whenever possible, a catechist will be assigned to the class for which the student has been enrolled to provide follow-up and foster accountability
- The requirements for Sacramental Preparation are to be followed
- Mass attendance by the family is a requirement (see note on Mass Attendance section)
- In case of a high school student with an underlying medical condition that prevents him from attending in-person classes, please contact the RE office to find an appropriate program of remote instruction
- Parents must sign the Consent for Online Education Platform
- The only instance of virtual instruction that might take place via any of the platforms contained in the Consent for Online Education Platforms form, is the training for Safe Environment Program (more information under that section). If that is the case, these rules will apply:
 - o Proper attire must be worn at all times
 - o No shirts exhibiting offensive or anti-Catholic slogans
 - o Student must be in an appropriate area in the house, for example at a desk, dining table; not on the bed
 - o Chat between the students will not be allowed
 - o Depending on the nature of the class, the session might be recorded. If so, the student will be asked to turn the camera on

Home-based RE Program

A variant from the online program is the home-based RE program where the student (kindergarten through 12th grade) will get a physical copy of the textbook without access to the online platform. Please inform the RE Office via email if you would prefer this option for your child.

Requirements:

- Families must submit the completed registration form and payment
- Parents must provide at least one email address that belongs to one of them; no student email addresses allowed
- Whenever possible, a catechist will be assigned to the class for which the student has been enrolled to provide follow-up and foster accountability
- The requirements for Sacramental Preparation are to be followed
- Mass attendance by the family is a requirement (see note on Mass Attendance section)

In-Person Classes

For the current school year 2020-2021, in-person classes are only available for students in grades 5 through 12. If by order of the Virginia government or diocesan mandate we are obliged to cease in-person classes, these students we will go to the online modality, and the requirements for the online program will be followed.

We will have 6 classes of 15 students each, which means we can only take 15 students per class. The distribution of classes will be as follows:

- Two classes* for combined 5th and 6th grade (15 students each)
- One class* for combined 7th and 8th grade (15 students)
- One class for students in the second year of Confirmation prep, i.e. students that attended the school year 2019-2020 and that are currently in 8th grade or 9th grade (15 students)
- Two classes for high school students in the second year of Confirmation prep, i.e. students that attended the school year 2019-2020 and that are currently in 9th-12th grade (15 students each)

We will be able to accommodate 90 students in total.

*These classes can be composed of returning or new students. Enrollment in all in-person classes will be on a first come first serve basis.

Date and Time of In-Person Classes

- Session day: Wednesday
- Session time: 7:30 pm – 8:45 pm
- The first class is October 7

Forms to be filled out and signed by the parents of students in-person classes

- Emergency/Authorization to Pick up
- Cell Phone Use
- Classroom Behavior
- Agreement for Parish Faith Formation Participants
- Consent for Online Education Platforms

Recommendation for Cancellations and Closings of In-Person Classes

- If any adult or child finds they were in close contact (less than 6 feet for 15 minutes or more) to a confirmed Covid-19 case, they should quarantine for 14 days and watch for symptoms

- A class should be cancelled if one student/catechist in the class has been diagnosed with Covid-19
- All six classes should be canceled if two or more classes at the same session must be canceled due to the diagnosis of students/catechists with Covid-19
- Families are to be notified of possible exposure to someone with Covid-19. No names or identifying information of the individuals with Covid-19 are to be given out
- Parents' Faith Formation (PFF) will not be cancelled but we ask parents to perform a health screening (as listed in the Agreement for Faith Formation Participants) before coming to each session

Mass Attendance*

"The Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life. Sunday is the day on which the paschal mystery is celebrated in light of the apostolic tradition and it is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church." (Cf. CCC 2177)

Children and their parents must attend the Eucharist as required by the Catechism of the Catholic Church, sections 2180 and 2181:

2180 – "The precept of the Church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass." 117 "The precept of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assistance at a Mass which is celebrated anywhere in a Catholic rite either on the holy day or on the evening of the preceding day."

2181 – "The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor." 119 "Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin."

Our parish offers a varied Mass schedule so that our parishioners can fulfill their Sunday obligation. Additionally, during Covid-19 Phase 3, we sanitize the church after all Masses to ensure that our parishioners can safely attend Mass.

Failing to come to Sunday Mass might hinder your child's understanding of and ability to receive the sacraments for which they are preparing.

*Given the ongoing Covid-19 crisis, Bishop Burbidge has retained the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

Attire for In-Person Classes/Retreats/Others

Children should wear modest clothes. Please no shorts. Bermudas are allowed.

Attendance and Make-up Work

There are a limited number of religious education classes, and your child is expected to attend every class unless he or she is ill. You are responsible for making sure that your child makes up all missed class work to be handed in at the next class attended, unless serious extenuating circumstances are brought to the attention of the Director of RE and approved by him/her.

Children are required to have a note from a parent for all absences turned into their teacher prior to the absence or immediately upon the students return to class. This *Excuse from Class* form can be obtained from the teacher, RE office or website. **More than five unexcused absences** or too many excused absences may result in your child repeating a year of instruction.

Children in any of the sacramental preparation classes may not receive the sacrament if there is an attendance problem.

Safety Policy

To comply with diocesan requirements, St. Philip will implement a safety plan that involves: (a) a fire drill and lockdown exercise; (b) controlled access at drop-off and pick-up; and (c) pick up procedures in case of an emergency. These procedures are equivalent to the safety measures already in place in our parochial school, and in most county schools. Although our catechists have received training, we ask parents to instruct their student to listen to instructions given by our volunteers, do what they are told, and not be afraid. We take this opportunity to remind our families to pray for the RE program at St. Philip, and the safety of our students and volunteers.

(a) Fire Drill and Lockdown Exercise

The date for the fire drill is in the RE calendar. The catechists will talk to the students about the lockdown procedures and proceed to do an exercise.

(b) Controlled Access

Monitored Areas

To better control access to the building we ask parents and guardians to abstain from using the doors to Hayden Hall (former cafeteria), or the school doors to access the building at drop-off and pick-up and during RE. The main doors will be the church doors. To assist us in monitoring the area of the building where RE is taking place we have Hall Guardians. These are parent volunteers that roam the school hallways and alert the RE office of anything suspicious. If you would like to volunteer in this capacity, please refer to the Volunteer section below.

Drop Off and Pick Up

In-Person Classes

Students will be dropped off at the school doors (Entrance 2), where they will meet their catechist. If Parents have to stay for a meeting or PFF (Parents' Faith Formation) they will be asked to use the church doors (Entrance 1) or Hayden Hall doors (Entrance 3), depending on where their meeting will take place. Parents are not allowed in hallways before, during, and after class.

For pick-up, catechists will bring their class to Entrances 1, 2 and 3 to be picked up by their parents *promptly*. Once rosters are finalized we will inform the parents what door their student will use for drop-off. As a courtesy to our volunteers, we ask that you pick up your child not later than 8:50.

We appreciate your compliance with our procedures for drop off and pick up. These procedures are in place for the safety of your children and failure to comply with them will result in your student's dismissal from the in-class program.

Exception for Drivers

Parents will determine if their child can drive himself/herself to and from St. Philip premises. At the beginning of the school year, parents will have to sign a form stating whether the child will drive himself.

In the event of an absence, parents of a student with permission to drive must email the RE office at RE@stphilipparish.com. Parents may be called if the RE office has not been notified of a student absence. A written note is required (even if an email has been sent) upon returning to the RE. The student is to bring that note to the RE office and it should contain the following information:

1. Student name
2. Reason for absence
3. Date/dates of absence
4. Signature of parent/guardian

Failure to notify the RE office will result in an unverified absence and the student is considered truant.

Pick-Up in Case of an Emergency

If it is not safe to enter the building, children can be picked up from the parking lot in front of the rectory. If cars are not allowed to enter the parish parking lot, children can be picked up from the eastside parking lot (lot closer to Holly Hill Drive) at Falls Church High School. In the event an incident occurs while the students are in the church, students will be picked up from the basketball court on the field. In all three scenarios parents and guardians will be asked to sign out the student. The person picking up has to be on the list of authorized persons to pick up.

Homework

Children in all grade levels will be expected to do either follow-up activities or preparation for the next class (i.e., homework). Please help your child follow through with any assignments given and discuss what they are learning.

RE classes are meant to be the complement to the parents' work of teaching their children in the faith. Please support this, by reviewing your child's work every week, helping with homework, and participating in your child's sacramental preparation.

While strictly speaking, not actually "homework" another great home resource available through the Parish is FORMED (<https://formed.org/>). The Parish subscription to FORMED gives you free access to inspiring movies and video-based studies, audio talks and e-books from the Church's most compelling speakers and authors. Please contact the RE office for questions and to have the parish code.

Student Discipline for In-Person Classes/Retreats/Others

All students are expected to behave respectfully toward their teachers and other students. All students are expected to treat the school building and classroom equipment with care.

Our teachers are volunteers who offer their time and talent to teach RE. Children come to RE to learn the teachings of the Catholic Church and Christian Faith. Both children and teachers must expect this time to be a time to learn and come to a deeper understanding of their faith in a positive and nurturing setting. In light of this, *if a child is being disruptive or unruly and continues to be so after a warning, he or she will be taken out of the classroom and a parent will be called to pick them up. Should a second incident occur that is disruptive to the teacher and other children, the child will be dismissed from the in-class program without refund of the tuition fee and put in the home-based catechetical program.*

See rules for virtual classes/meetings above for behavior at virtual sessions.

Safe Environment Training

The Office of Child Protection and Safety for the Diocese of Arlington provides programs to ensure a safe environment for children within the community of the Church. We as a parish are mandated to have a training session for grades kindergarten through 12, and a make-up session for those students that missed the day of training. This is not sex education but training in a virtuous life. The materials for all grades are available upon request and the RE office will send the parent component in the fall of the current year. Parents are encouraged to have their child attend this session, but they are free to opt out for which they will have to fill out and sign a form that can be obtained from the RE office.

Dates of training for in-person students will be announced in advance.

For online students, the RE office will look into the possibility of offering this training through a Zoom meeting for which the date for each corresponding grade will be announced in advance. Per diocesan mandate, this Zoom meeting will be recorded, attendance checked and the guidelines in the Consent for Online Education Platforms will be followed.

Should the parents of online or homeschooled students opt for training at home, they will be expected to send the RE office an email with the date of training which has to happen no later than December. The RE office will send the materials needed for training at home by the parents.

Use of Cell Phones/Electronic Devices

Students may not use cell phones or other electronic devices at any time during the in-person RE session or while at an RE activity. Students are permitted to bring cell phones or other electronic devices to RE under the following conditions:

- a. The student must have written parental permission to have the device
- b. The device must be turned off at the beginning of the session/activity
- c. The device may be collected by the catechist at the beginning of the session/activity, and returned at the end
- d. Unauthorized use of an electronic device will result in immediate confiscation of the device, and a \$25.00 fine to be paid by the parent.

Progress Report

Your child's teacher will issue a progress report twice during the year. The purpose of the progress report is to inform parents of their child's attendance, academic progress and discipline in class and in liturgical activities. In some cases where a child is having difficulties due to attendance or other situations, the teacher may require that the progress report be signed by the parent and returned to the teacher.

Picture Policy

Student Supplies

Students will be provided with a textbook and handouts. The textbook is included in the RE fee. There is a replacement fee for lost books.

Every week your child will need the following items that **you** provide:

- Catholic Bible (2nd – 12th graders)
- Pens and/or pencils
- 5th – 12th graders need a composition book for notes

Snow Days or Cancellations

We follow FCPS for cancellations due to weather. To sign up for notifications from FCPS please visit their website.

Student Custody and Guardianship

At the time of registration in the RE program or at any other time where a change in custody status/arrangements occurs, it is the responsibility of the parent(s) to provide the RE office with a true and correct copy of the legal document for any student for which there is a legal custody agreement or for any student not residing with his/her parent.

RE office communication with the appropriate guardian is essential. Accordingly:

- (a) Custodial parents should identify in writing other adults who may have access to information regarding their child.
- (b) Likewise, custodial parents should keep in mind that non-custodial parents may receive information (when requested) regarding the child unless specific documentation to the contrary is provided in the legal custody agreement.

Parent Faith Formation (PFF)

Parents are the primary educators in the faith of their child. However, St. Philip has to provide instances where the adults are nurtured in their knowledge of the faith and their relationship with our Lord. Embracing the Catholic beliefs means that we must assimilate our life to the life of God's only Son, Jesus Christ. To this end, St. Philip will have mandatory* sessions for parents in English and in Spanish during the in-person RE, i.e. Wednesdays, 7:30 pm – 8:30 pm, in the church and/or Hayden Hall.

- Sessions in English: 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month
- Sessions in Spanish: 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month

*If for medical or personal reasons, parents are not comfortable attending these PFF, please inform the RE Office. The RE Office does not have the means to live stream these sessions in social media, but we will share with parents any handouts that might be distributed at these meetings.

Communication with Parents

The RE office relies on the contact information parents provide at the time of registration. It is the responsibility of the parents to supply a current email address, cell phone number and cell phone provider, and update them as needed.

Volunteers

The Religious Education Office relies on volunteers to help us in our task of providing our children with a sound religious formation. If you feel called to this ministry, please contact one of our priests, the RE office or the parish office. Our volunteers have to be compliant with diocesan requirements, Catholic in good standing, and living according to the laws of the Catholic Church. Our needs: Catechists and Catechist Aide.

Important

Sacramental Preparation at Saint Philip Parish

The sacramental preparation of the children involves the whole family and, in a special way, the parents. Catechetical instruction for the child will not flourish if the parents are not having their faith permeate all aspects of their lives. In order to accomplish this, fathers and mothers need a personal, intimate relationship with God, and this is achieved by improving their knowledge of God and understanding the life that Christ wants them to lead: His life. Christ is the model for us to follow to have that close relationship with the Holy Trinity. Even though we are adults, we still need guidance in order for us to live like Christ.

St. Philip will make it a priority to catechize and guide parents who want the Sacraments of their children to bear fruit. Parents of all students registered in the parish RE program for sacramental preparation will have to attend Faith Formation sessions (PFF) during the time it will take to prepare their child. More information about each specific Sacrament is available below.

GOALS OF PARENTS' FAITH FORMATION (PFF)

Our goals are that parents:

- Grow in intimacy with our Lord so as to be able to keep the Lord's presence in everything they do
- Consider Sunday Mass a non-negotiable family duty
- Attend frequent confession for themselves and their children
- Create an environment at home where conversations about God and a virtuous life are frequent and natural

- Meet other parish families and find in these friendships encouragement, examples of virtue, and love for their parish family

BAPTISM

Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks; as soon as possible after the birth or even before it, they are to go to the pastor to request the sacrament for their child and to be prepared properly for it (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1). Parents will contact the rectory to schedule their attendance at two baptism classes that take place once a month, depending on the language of the class (English or Spanish). These two sessions are a requirement for all parents. Parents will have to choose one or two sponsors (godparents) for their child.

Requirements for a Sponsor/Godparent for Baptism and Confirmation

The sponsor (godparent) can be a woman and/or a man of legal age to be a Sponsor of Baptism or Confirmation in the Catholic Church (i.e. 16 years or older), and they have to affirm the following:

- That he/she has received the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- That he/she faithfully participates in Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and gives witness to his/her faith in Christ Jesus by regularly receiving Him in Holy Communion.
- (For married Catholics) That he/she is validly married according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- (For religious or clergy) That he/she is in good standing with my religious community or the Diocese to which he belongs
- (For single Catholics) That he/she is living a Christian life in accord with the laws of God and the Catholic Church.
- That he/she actively strives to live out their commitment to Christ and to the community life of the Church by their loving response to those with whom they come in contact daily.
- That he/she will give support to the person they are sponsoring by their prayers and by the Christian example of their daily life. He/she will help him/her be faithful to the Catholic Faith.

Cases when Baptism has been delayed

Baptism for children 7 years old or younger

- The student must have one year of instruction at home or in the Parish, if in-person classes are being offered for that age group
- The student must continue preparation for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion
- Parents must attend PFF (see note in PFF section)
- The family must attend Sunday Mass
- Parents will have to choose one or two sponsors (godparents) and the requirements are as above

Baptism for children 8 years old and older

- It will be at the discretion of the Pastor if the student is enrolled in the one-year Baptism program, or the three-year preparation
 - o For the one-year preparation – as above
 - o For the three-year preparation

- The student must have three years of instruction at home or in the Parish, if in-person classes are being offered for that age group
- After the third year, the student will take an exam to assess his/her preparedness for the Sacrament; a score of 75% will be required to pass
- If less than 75%, the student will do extra preparation
- If the score is 75% or above, the Sacraments of Initiation will be administered; more information will be forthcoming
- Parents must attend PFF all three years (see note in PFF section)
- The family must attend Sunday Mass
- Parents will have to choose one or two sponsors (godparents) for Baptism, and once sponsor (godparent) for Confirmation; the requirements for each are as above

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

In the diocese of Arlington, First Holy Communion is administered when the child is in 2nd grade. The child will receive First Holy Communion in 2nd grade as long as:

- The child has received two years of catechetical instruction done at home or in the Parish
- The family attends Sunday Mass
- The student passes the First Holy Communion and First Confession Exam with at least a score of 75%
- Parents have attended at least one year of PFF (see note in PFF section)

Cases when First Holy Communion has been delayed

- The student must have three years of catechetical instruction done at home or in the Parish, if in-person classes are being offered for that age group
- After the third year, the student will take an exam to assess his/her preparedness for the Sacrament; a score of 75% will be required to pass
- If less than 75%, the student will do extra preparation
- If the score is 75% or above, the student will be able to receive First Holy Communion
- Parents must attend PFF all three years
- The family must attend Sunday Mass

CONFIRMATION

In the Diocese of Arlington, Confirmation is administered in 8th grade. The child will be confirmed in 8th grade as long as:

- The child has received three years of catechetical instruction done at home or in the parish
- Attends Sunday Mass
- The student passes the Comprehensive Confirmation Exam with at least a score of 75%
- Parents have attended at least one year of PFF (see note in PFF section)

Cases when Confirmation has been delayed

- The student must have three years of catechetical instruction done at home or in the Parish, if in-person classes are being offered for that age group
- After the third year, the student will take an exam to assess his/her preparedness for the Sacrament; a score of 75% will be required to pass

- If less than 75%, the student will do extra preparation
- If the score is 75% or above, the student will be able to be confirmed
- Parents must attend PFF all three years (see note in PFF section)
- The family must attend Sunday Mass
- Parents will have to choose one sponsor (godparent) for Confirmation; the requirements for the sponsor are as above

PARENTS' MEETINGS AND STUDENTS' RETREATS

Parents' Meetings

In order to better guide the parents in their child's process of formation for the Sacraments, we will have a meeting for Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation sometime in the fall. These meetings will be announced in advance and conducted in English and Spanish separately. At least one parent must attend the meeting. Please do not bring children.

Students' Retreats

Candidates to Sacraments in their final year of preparation will have a day of spiritual recollection either in or outside the parish. The parents will receive more information at the meeting for the Sacrament for which their child is being prepared. As a general rule, we keep First Holy Communion candidates and catechumens (those opting for the Sacraments of Initiation) at the parish, and Confirmation candidates at another location. It will depend on what we are allowed to do, the means available, and the parents' willingness to help. These retreats are mandatory for the students.

PARENT/GUARDIAN

I have received a current copy of the religious education (RE) Handbook. In doing so, I have explained the content of this document to my child. I acknowledge and agree to the policies contained therein, and will require my child to comply with the policies which apply to students.

I also realize that during my child's enrollment at the RE program, I will be informed from time to time, formally or informally, of various changes in the program and/or diocesan policies. I understand the RE program and/or Diocese reserves the right to change policies at any given time, with or without advance notice. I further understand it is required for me to sign this form in order to continue my child's enrollment at the program.

PADRES/TUTORES
